## Speaker biographies

### Robert Carr, Solicitor Advocate and Partner, Anderson Strathern

Robert Carr is Solicitor Advocate and Partner (having recently completed a term as Chair) at Anderson Strathern LLP, one of Scotland's leading law firms.
